Holy Land Classic 2012

22 Oct (M) – Depart USA

Your spiritual pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight.

23 Oct (T) – Arrive in the Holy Land

Our Representatives will greet you at the airport and escort you to your bus. Enjoy a driving tour of the port of Jaffa. Jonah fled the call of the Lord here (Jonah 1) and cedars for the First Temple were brought here from Lebanon (II Chronicles 2). Finish the day at your Netanya (Mediterranean) hotel for dinner and overnight.

24 Oct (W) – Caesarea, Mount Carmel, Megiddo, Cana, Nazareth

Begin our first morning in the Holy Land at the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre at Caesarea, a center of the early Christians. Here, Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new religion (Acts 10) and Paul was imprisoned before being taken to Rome for trial. Look out over the Valley of Jezreel from the heights of Mount Carmel. On this mount, Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Recall Jesus' first miracle as you pass through Cana (John 2). Head south and inland to Megiddo on the plains of Armageddon. Here Solomon and

other Israeli kings had a major center for commerce and military protection. See the city of Nazareth, once the quiet village of Jesus' youth (Matthew 2). Explore the Nazareth Village, a living presentation of the life, times, and teachings of Jesus. Finish the day at the Jordan River, with an opportunity to remember your baptism. Check into your kibbutz resort for dinner and overnight.

25 Oct (Th) – Sea of Galilee

See The Valley of the Winds and Doves, a valley between two stone outcroppings where Jesus walked. With Bible in hand, cross the waters of the Sea of Galilee aboard a Kinnereth Sailing Company boat. Along the way, participate in a special on board worship service. Travel to Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilee. Visit the synagogue that stands on the site where Jesus taught and preached the gospel of the Kingdom (Matt. 4: 13, 23). Travel to the Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus preached to the crowds (Matt. 5-7). Also visit Gideon's

Spring (Ein Harod) where Gideon chose his army of 300 by observing how they drank from the springs (Jd. 7). Pass through the Jordan Valley to the Dead Sea to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

26 Oct (F) – (Optional Masada) / Jericho, Qumran to Jerusalem

This morning, enjoy time at the hotel and the Dead Sea, or take an optional trip to Masada, Herod's mountaintop fortress that became the last stronghold of the Jewish Rebellion against the Romans.

Ride the cable car to the top to explore, and peer down on the Dead Sea, the remains of the Roman camps, and the siege ramp below. Leaving the hotel, your group continues on to Jericho. Visit the ruins of the ancient city that was conquered by Joshua (Josh. 6:30). From Jericho, you can see the traditional site of the temptation of Jesus (Matt. 4:1-11). Travel next to Qumran, site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery, to discuss the mysterious community of Essenes who once lived on the shores of the Dead Sea.

Then continue up to Jerusalem through the Judean Wilderness, inspiration for the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10). Finish your day looking out over Jerusalem from Mount Scopus and check into your hotel for dinner and overnight.

27 Oct (Sat) – Bethlehem and the Mount of Olives

This morning, cross over to visit the Herodium, the fortified palace and final resting place of Herod the Great. In

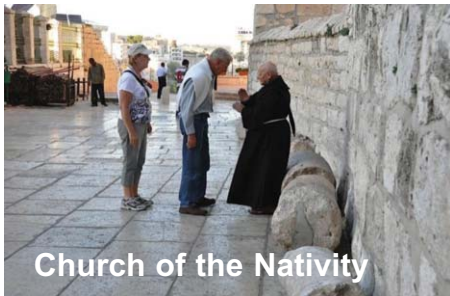

Church of the Nativity

Bethlehem, you'll visit the cave revered as the place where Jesus was born (Matt. 1: 18 - 25; Luke 2: 1- 7). The Church of the Nativity, which was constructed on the site, is the world's

oldest functioning church. Nearby you'll view Shepherds' Field where the Good News was first proclaimed. Stand next atop the Mount of Olives as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem, including the Temple Mount and Dome of the Rock. Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives (Acts 1: 9 - 12). Visit the Chapel of the Ascension and pray in the Garden of Gethsemane as Jesus did (Matt. 26: 36 - 44).

28 Oct (Sun) – Ancient Jerusalem

Begin at Mount Zion, visiting the House of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was imprisoned for a night (Matt. 26: 57 - 65). Stand in the Upper Room, traditional site of the Last Supper (Mark 14: 12 – 26). Visit the Southern Wall Excavations of the ancient Temple including the Teaching Steps and the Western (Wailing) Wall. Walk the Cardo, the ancient main street of the Old City once lined with shops, now partially restored. Wander the excavations of the City of David. Walk the steps to the Pool of Siloam, recently uncovered at the foot of the City. Explore Hezekiah's Tunnel, an amazing engineering feat that was dug from either end and met in the middle! (Note: Those who are claustrophobic may want to meet the group at the other end of the tunnel!) Stand on the steps of the Pool of Siloam, where Jesus healed the blind man (John 9).

29 Oct (M) – Israel Museum, Yad Vashem

Look out over the First Century Model of the City of Jerusalem, now housed at the Israel Museum. The museum itself houses

10,000 years of archeological artifacts. Also visit the Shrine of the Book, where the Book of Isaiah, discovered among the Dead Sea Scrolls, is displayed. Walk the museum and grounds of Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum, as a reminder of why we must never let this happen again. Return to the Old City for time on your own to explore and shop.

30 Oct (T) – Christian Jerusalem

Conditions permitting, walk the Temple Mount area. View the Pool of Bethesda (John 5: 1-31) where Jesus performed the Sabbath miracle, and sing a hymn in the Church of St. Anne. Visit Herod's Antonia Fortress where Jesus was brought before Pontius Pilate (Luke 23: 1-11). Walk the Via Dolorosa, "the Way of the Cross," and stand in reverence at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Visit Golgotha and worship at the Garden Tomb, possible site of the garden of Joseph of Arimathea, and celebrate the reality of the Resurrection.

31 Oct (W) – Return to USA or Jordan Extension

Return home with the memories of the people, places, and experiences of the Holy Land, or continue on a Jordan Extension.

Day 10 In the morning, you will cross the Allenby Bridge into Jordan. View the "promised land" as Moses did from the summit of **Mt. Nebo**. Nearby **Madaba** is home to a beautiful 6th century mosaic of Jerusalem. Visit Philadelphia, one of the ten cities of the Decapolis, and now **Amman**.

Day 11 Early in the morning you'll journey to the famous rock city of **Petra**, literally cut into the cliff sides. Return to Amman for a late dinner and overnight.

Day 12 Explore the ruins of **Jerash**, Jordan's best-preserved Greco-Roman town. Depart the Holy Land this evening.

Day 13 Arrive in the USA.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Price is based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$100 per night; single rooms \$180 per night. Meals for extra nights are not included.
